His son Alan was leaving Santa Barbara and the University asked Dermot if he knew of any players. I'll never forget what he has done for me," Byrne said.

The ambitious young man who

couldn't refuse Santa Barbara's offer of an athletic scholarship was on his way.

In 2003 he moved to the west coast and he hasn't looked back. He was a captain for UCSB when they won the 2006 NCAA title.


